Call for exhibits

From April, 4th 2013 - June, 30th 2013 the Kumu Art Museum in Tallinn, Estonia, will host an exhibition on computer and video games from Germany and France named "Let's play !? french and german video games". It is organized by the FRENCH INSTITUTE and the GOETHE INSTITUTE with the help of the French-German Fund in third countries. The exhibition will be developed by the Computerspielemuseum in Berlin and Plaine ImageS in Lille.

The exhibition will feature state of the art computer and video games from France and Germany, representing a range of different game genres from independent to AAA games and from action to learning games, together with examples, which presents future trends. Ideally one or two joint French German game projects are featured.

The exhibition is highly interactive, since most of the exhibited games will be offered to play. Beyond usual gaming platforms, the exhibition will also show one or two unique interactive installations, which attract visitors with big screens and low barrier interaction possibilities.

The organizers ask now French and German game developers to send in suggestions for exhibits, if they think, that their game or work fits into the context. Because the game will be exhibited interactively abroad it is mandatory, that the game offers an English navigation or at least can be played, without a need to read something or understand something spoken. Also it shouldn't have an age rating over 18 years. Please send your suggestions until February, 17th 2013 to:

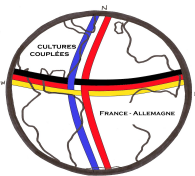
